The premiere: BSC's Dorothy Hindman wrote "Is This Then a Touch?" in Rome two years, but had Seigel in mind. Its visceral text, from Walt Whitman's "Leaves of Grass," translated to a biting, dissonant score with a stinging catharsis.

Lizbie's encore: In an encore, a setting of Thomas Hardy's "To Lizbie Browne,"

Seigel brilliantly exuded the tender passion in the text's account of unrequited love.
